Parenting LGBTQ+ Youth April 10 | 6-8 PM | Zoom

The core purposes of this training include:

- Set a new base for understanding the harms LGBTQ+ children and youth experience at home and in foster care
- Help you understand the attitudes and behaviors that promote safety, permanency, and well-being with LGBTQ+ Youth.
- Understand the unique needs of trans and nonbinary children and youth in care.

Using prepared content, videos, and discussion, this training provides information on LGBTQ+ terminology, identity development, and misconceptions. The impact of family accepting and rejecting behaviors when a child "comes out" will be explored and guidance will be provided on ways to promote the well-being of an LGBTQ+ child whether or not you agree with or support their LGBTQ+ identity.
