Is the home clean, safe, and in good repair? Are all animals in the home safe to be around members of the household and children who may be placed in the home The foster parent must notify the agency within 3 business days if the family acquire a new pet All animals in the home must be licensed and vaccinated.
The foster parents must ensure that the water is clean, safe and sanitary before using residential pools, spa, or hot tub.
Children must be supervised at all times around water activities. If the foster parents have a pool or hot tub; is there rescue equipment available at
all times? If there is a pool and or hot tub on the premise; does the family have alarms on the exterior doors that lead directly to the water activities.
Is the home heat, light, and ventilation adequate Have the foster parent's ensured that the foster home windows and doors have screens in them (if used for ventilation)

Behavior Management

The foster parent may use reasonable restraint to prevent the child from harming
herself or other persons in the home
A foster parent shall not use corporal punishment for any reason with a foster child.
Emergencies
Does the foster parent know the agencies policies regarding the following:

Unusual incidents
The foster parents must notify the agency immediately of the death of a foster child The foster parents must notify the agency immediately of a removal or attempt
removal of a foster child from the foster home by any person not authorized by the
agency.
The foster parent should notify the agency immediately if the foster child is missing.
The foster parent should notify the agency within 24 hours if any of the following
occur:
Any illness that results to inpatient hospitalization
Accidents/injury that requires medical treatment
If the foster child was involved with law enforcement authorities
Pregnancy of a foster child
All incidents of child-on-child abuse
If anyone in the home is involved in a criminal investigation
Hazardous materials
Are all hazardous materials, object, weapons, chemicals, medication or equipment
out of the reach of children?
Foster parents must follow these conditions regarding firearms:
Are the firearms stored in a locked metal or solid wood gun safe or
Is the trigger locked and stored without ammunition in a locked area
Ammunition must be stored in a separate locked location
A handgun should be registered, and documentation should be provided to
the agency.
Training
Licensed foster parents must attend training; totaling to at least 6 clock hours per
year.
At least one adult member of the household must maintain a certification in first aid
from the American Heart Association or the American Red Cross.
Food and nutrition
foster parents will provide the foster child with meals that are nutritious, well-
balanced and sufficient quantity.
If the foster child is on a special diet, the foster parents will follow this diet.
Only a licensed physician may prescribe the foster child with a special diet.
Foster parents will allow the foster child to eat with other members in the
household.
The foster child will be served with the same meals as other members in the home,
unless a physician prescribed them a special diet or unless differing nutritional
requirements related to the child's age, medical condition, or religious belief.
Foster parents will refrigerate perishable foods.
A foster parent will only serve pasteurized milk products to foster children.
Foster parents will ensure that foster children are safe while in a motor vehicle,
abiding by Michigan's safety restraint laws.
Reporting and record keeping

If a foster parent suspects physical or sexual abuse or neglect of a child they are to
report it to central intake.
If the foster parent suspect's physical or sexual abuse or neglect occurred within the
foster home or to the foster child they are to report it immediately to the following:
Child protective services central intake
The agency
The foster parents are also required to provide a written report of the incident
A foster parent is to report to the agency any changes within the foster home by the
next working day; including the following.
A change in employment status of a foster parent
Serious illness, injury, or death of a foster parent or a member of the
household
Changes in within the household
Arrest and criminal convictions to foster parents or members in the home _
Court-supervised parole or probation of a foster parent or member of the
home
Admissions or release from a correctional facility of a foster parent or
member of the home
Admissions or release to a hospital/institution for the treatment of emotional,
mental, or substance abuse of a foster parent or member of the household.
Counseling, treatment, or therapy on a outpatient basis for emotional, mental,
or substance abuse of a foster parent or a member of the household.
A foster parent will need to notify the agency within 5 days after filing an application
for an adult foster care license, a family child care home certificate of registration, or a
group child care home license
The foster parent will need to notify the agency if there is a change in the terms of
the adult foster care or child care license or registration.
A foster parent will need to inform the agency of any changes of residence and
submit an application for licensure at the new address 4 weeks before the move.
Confidentiality
The foster parents will agree to keep information obtained, records maintained,
regarding a foster child and a foster child's parents confidential.
A foster parent will maintain a record for each foster child in the home; the record
will include the following:
Child's name and date of birth
History of child abuse or neglect
All known emotional and psychological problems of the child
All known behavioral problems of the child
Information that will enable the foster parent to provide a stable, safe, and
healthy environment for the foster child and foster family.
Date of placement, date of termination
All records will be returned to the agency after the child has moved from the home.
